
Morris Hills Regional District Instructions for Students Applying to the Magnet Program

Thank you for your interest in the Magnet Program. Incomplete applications will not be considered. The application deadline is November 25, 2024.

Ensure that each item in the checklist below is complete:

- □ If you do **not** live in Denville, Rockaway Borough, Rockaway Township, or Wharton, complete the Intent to Participate Form and submit it to your resident district **no later than** November 25th (In-district residents and Tier 2 Choice students can skip this step).
- □ All applicants should complete the online application **no later than November 25th.** Your parent/guardian will need to create an account in order to apply. Indicate which program you are applying for. **All applicants can only apply to one program for School Choice.**
- □ The online application portal includes a section for you to electronically request recommendations from your teachers (more info below) and to electronically request your school records from your counselor or other school official. You can find the recommendation section under "Requirements to be Completed." You will need the email addresses of your recommenders to complete this step. Your teachers and counselor will receive a link via email to complete their portion of the application.
- □ The following recommendations will be needed for the Magnet Program:
 - 1 recommendation from a 7th or 8th grade Math OR Science Teacher
 - 1 recommendation from a 7th or 8th grade English OR Social Studies Teacher
 - 0 1 Counselor/School Information Form
- □ Magnet candidates will be required to take the Accuplacer math exam in Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, and Statistics (QAS). You will have the opportunity to choose a test date (November 23rd or December 7th) at the time when you apply. Admissions test dates and times will be available on a first come, first served basis.
- □ Magnet candidates who are also applying to the Academy for Math, Science, and Engineering will take the QAS at MCVTS during Academy testing and cannot take the test again for the Magnet Program. MCVTS will share the QAS results with Morris Hills Regional District.
- □ If you need accommodations for the exams as per an IEP/ISP or 504 Plan, please contact Dr. Zoeller at <u>nzoeller@mhrd.org</u> prior to your test date. Students with extended time accommodations should select a 9 AM testing session.

Applicants may check online whether recommendations and counselor information have been received by logging in to their account and checking the "Completed Requirements" section. If we have successfully received the recommendation, you will see the recommendation under the "Completed Requirements" header, as pictured below.



ADMISSIONS PROCESS

Admission to the Magnet Program is competitive. In-district students are given priority in the admissions process. After qualified in-district students have been admitted, remaining seats will be offered to qualified choice candidates. The admissions criteria for in-district and choice candidates are identical. All applications are reviewed by an Admissions Committee consisting of district administrators and teachers.

Admissions decisions are based on:

- Review of student's academic record
- Review of other school documentation (attendance record and discipline record)
- Successful completion of any prerequisites
- Teacher recommendations (7th or 8th grade teachers preferred)
- Admissions test score (QAS Score)

The Magnet Program runs at both Morris Hills and Morris Knolls High School. In-district residents will attend the Magnet Program at the school designated by their residence. Out-of- district residents will be assigned to available seats in the Magnet Program by the district in either school. Any student with a sibling currently enrolled at Morris Hills or Morris Knolls may have the option to attend the same school as his or her sibling, pending space availability.

Morris Hills Regional District Testing Information

All* candidates will take admissions tests on their scheduled date and time at **Morris Hills High School**, **520 West Main St. in Rockaway.** The test date will be selected during the application submission. Test dates and times are available on a first come, first served basis. Once you submit the application, your test date and time are confirmed, unless you receive an email stating otherwise.

*Magnet candidates who are also applying to the Academy for Math, Science, and Engineering will take their QAS admissions test <u>with MCVTS</u> on the assigned date. MCVTS will send Morris Hills Regional the QAS score. Applicants can not take the QAS more than one time.

Magnet Students:

Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, & Statistics: 75 minutes (timed test) -computer-based test -scrap paper allowed (will be provided on site) -calculators are <u>not</u> permitted -Practice questions and additional information can be found at https://accuplacer.collegeboard.org/students/prepare-for-accuplacer/practice

Parents/guardians must drop their students off at the front of the building (use the circle and return for pickup). Parents/guardians will not be permitted in the building.

What to Bring:

- Pencils
- An Eraser
- Water

Students who have any type of electronic device on their person (turned on or off) during testing will have their test voided and will not be permitted to retest. Cell phones must be kept turned off and in a closed bag or backpack during the entire testing period, including the break.

Students who have an IEP/ISP or 504 Plan and need accommodations for testing should contact Dr. Zoeller immediately. In case of inclement weather, we will notify you of cancellation via phone using the number you provided on the application and via the district website, www.mhrd.org.
