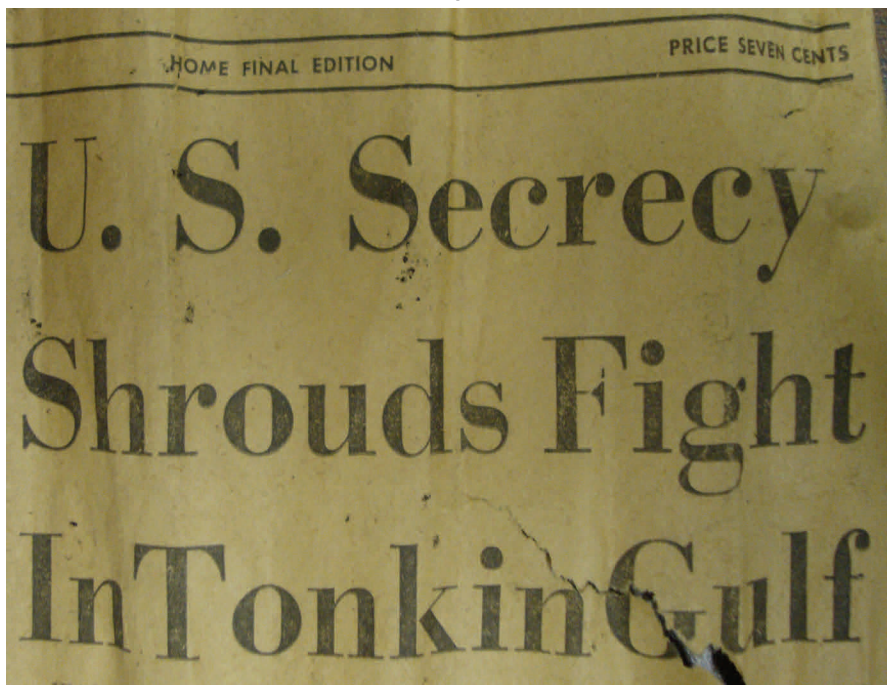

The girls were judged upon their appearance, voice, enthusiasm, reliability, school loyalty, and ability to perform stunts.

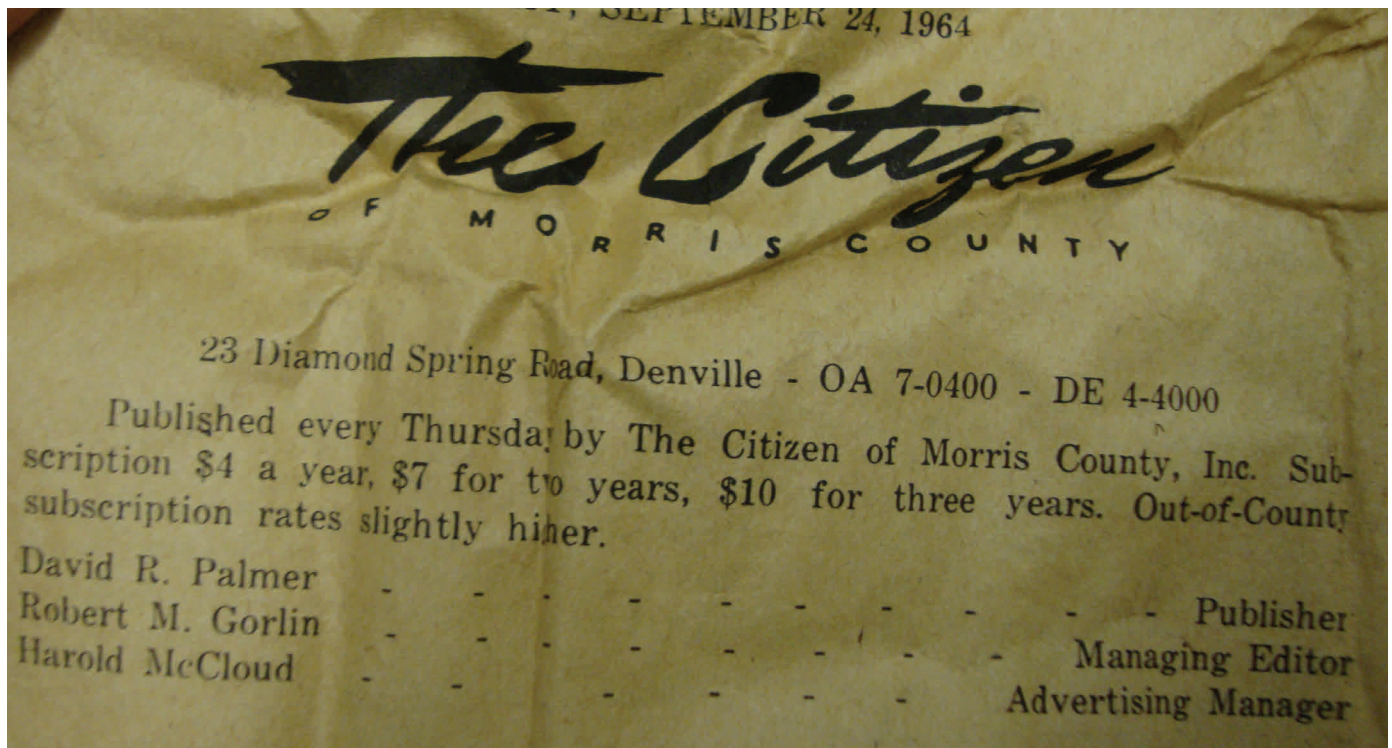
