My "Aha! Moment"

1 INT. MS. BAUER'S OFFICE- MAY OF SOPHOMORE YEAR

NICOLE, a high school sophomore, is presenting her independent study proposal to MS. BAUER, the independent study coordinator. She endeavors to spend some time exploring writing during her junior year.

NICOLE

...and for the third quarter of the year, I am going to do some script writing.

MS. BAUER

Okay. And what do you hope to accomplish? Are you writing for TV or for the stage?

NICOLE

I think it will be an interesting exercise, nothing serious. I want to experiment in writing for TV.

2 CUT TO: INT. SCHOOL LIBRARY- THIRD QUARTER OF JUNIOR YEAR

She has taught herself the formatting and technicality of script writing and learned how to convey her intended message to both the actors who are reading the script as well as the viewers who are seeing the actions on the screen. Though she is only on the introduction of what will be the script for a half-hour long show, she feels that she is making great progress, not only on the plot and stage directions of the script but also as a writer with the potential to work in any profession. Something clicked in her head, and she realized that screenwriting, the genre that she was not looking forward to working in, was something that she truly loved doing. As she continued working, she thought of all that she had to tell her mentor the next time they met.

MS.BAUER

Conveying the events of the plot in a way that the viewer can understand without having a copy of the script is something that I struggled with at first, but I have come to realize that showing instead of telling is a vital skill for a writer to have. When I work on my script, it is like I am watching a TV episode in my head and writing down what I see.

MS. BAUER

Is this something you are considering as a potential profession?

NICOLE

I would love to become a screenwriter! But I am open to other career paths as well.
